
# BIBLE STUDY/DISCUSSION GUIDE Ephesians Chapter 1 questions

Start by reading the introduction to chapter one of Ephesians. According to the first paragraph of the introduction, why is what happened in the church in Ephesus so important?

Read Ephesians 1:1-2 and the study note for the title. Even though Ephesus is no longer a city in the modern world, what country would this city and area be located today?

After reading Ephesians 1:3-14 and the study notes for Ephesians 1:13, what does the term "sealed" in verse 13 mean?

According to the study note for Ephesians 1:14, why is the passage you read from verses 3-14 special?



## **Ephesians Chapter 2 questions**


Start by reading the introduction to chapter two of Ephesians. According to the introduction and the verses in this chapter, what is the promise that every believer has and can know for sure that they have eternal life?

Read Ephesians 2:1-7 and the study note for these verses. According to the verses and the study note, why do we need God?

Now read Ephesians 2:8-9. These are two of the most important verses in the New Testament. According to the verse

and the study note for Ephesians 2:8, even if you knew every sentence, verse, and word in the Bible, what is the key to knowing you are going to heaven?

Now read the study note to Ephesians 2:9. What is the combination of our faith and our works that that people need to see from each of us, whether they are a believer or non-believer?



According to the study note for Ephesians 2:17, what does the Holy Spirit bring to us that is beyond what any of us can even understand?

What does peace mean to you, personally? Give an example of peace in your life.

According to the study note from Ephesians 2:18-22, believers should be united in their walk before God and with other believers. Why is the unity of believers so important according to the study note?

## **Ephesians Chapter 3 questions**

Start by reading the introduction to the third chapter of Ephesians. Answer some questions about the church you currently attended (or the last church you attended). If you have never attended a church, answer these questions as if you would be attending a new church:

Where do you attend church?

Why do you attend this specific church?

Would you change where you attend church if you were able?

Is your church a "really good" church, or is it just "good enough"?

Who do you tell and invite to your church when you have the opportunity?

Read Ephesians 3:1-7 and the study note for Ephesians 3:1. Paul had a cause. Joshua (according to the study note) had a cause. What cause or causes are you focused on in your life right now?

What makes these causes worth living for every day?

Read Ephesians 3:8-13 and the study note for Ephesians 3:13. We all have times of trouble or times that we struggle. Share a time or a struggle that you had. Where did you turn to during this time?

Have you ever helped someone through a similar time in his or her life? Where did you turn to help him or her?

Did you pray for yourself through your times of struggle? Did you pray for the people you helped through their time(s) and struggles? Why or why not?

Read Ephesians 3:14-21. Read the study note on Ephesians 3:17. According to the verse and the study note, why is it so important for God to live in our hearts?

## **Ephesians Chapter 4 questions**

Start by reading the introduction to chapter four of Ephesians. According to this introduction, what does this chapter start with that can help us in our everyday lives?

Read Ephesians 4:1-10 and the study note for Ephesians 4:1-6. What are three areas that the study note shares that our walk can match our talk?

After reading the introduction to chapter five of Ephesians, share what you define as good and what you define as bad.

What do you think God sees as good and bad?

What is the command Paul gives the church of Ephesus in Ephesians 5:1 that we should also follow today?

## **Ephesians Chapter 6 questions**


After reading the introduction to chapter six of Ephesians, share the four areas that the Bible is supposed to help each of us with every day:
