EMOJIs and the Gospel of John - Chapter 17 questions

Read the introduction to John chapter 17. After reading the introduction, here is a question to answer, and this is the opposite from the last chapter: If you were leaving to go somewhere for an extended period of time, such as to the military, or off to college, or moving to another state, would you rather they have a big going away party to say good bye to you or would you rather people took the time to say goodbye to you personally?

Read the study note and John 17:1. What are some times and things that you pray for throughout the week?

Read John 17:2-9 as the prayer of Jesus continues. Read the study note on ¹John 17:5. If you were made in the image of Jesus, how do others see that in the things you do or say?

After reading John 17:10-12, Jesus is talking about one person specifically. Read the study note for John 17:12. Who is Jesus referring to according to the note?

What is the term that Jesus uses in his prayer, according to verse 12?

As the prayer continues in John 17:13-15, Jesus shares in his prayer something that is a theme throughout the Gospel of John. What did he pray for us to have according to verse 13?

Verse 16 sees a shift in the prayer of Jesus. He uses a word in verse 17 that we do not usually use. What is that word and what did Jesus mean by it according to the study note for John 17:17?

Share some ways that you can be sanctified, or set apart, to be used by God and for God with the talents and gifts He has given you:

Read the prayer from John 18 to the end of the chapter. Jesus summarizes His relationship with God in the last two verses. Read the study note on John 17:25-26. Summarize here the relationship between you and God here:
